- •Genesis in summary: Four great events: creation, sin, flood, Babel; Four great men: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph
 —Men with a particular description attached to them: Abraham, David, Joseph
- •Joseph exemplified virtue, humility, wisdom and great faith. Needed role model for us today.

I. Joseph Submitted To Authority

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Parental authority. (Gen. 37:2,12-17)
-"Here am I." (Gen. 37:13)
Eph. 6:1-4; Col. 3:20-21
Prov. 29:15; Heb. 12:5ff
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- •Governmental authority. (Gen. 45:19-21; Rom. 13:1; Acts 5:29)
- •Divine authority. (Gen. 39:9)
 - -Col. 3:17; I Pet. 4:11; II Jn. 9
 - -Jn. 12:48

II. Joseph Resisted Temptation

- •He steadfastly resisted the evil advances of Potiphar's wife. (Gen. 39:1-12)
- Excuses Joseph could have made for sin:
 - -l'm a young person. (Eccl. 12:1; Gal. 6:7-8)
 - -l' away from home. (Ps. 139)
 - -Temptation is just too strong. (I Cor. 10:13; Js. 4:7)
 - -Look at all I've been through, etc.
- Steadfastly refused to give into lust.
 - -You are another man's wife. (Gen. 39:9; Mk. 6:18; Heb. 13:4)
 - -Great sin and wickedness against God. (Ps. 51:3-4; Heb. 4:12-13)
- •The answer to temptation, the permissive and promiscuous society is seen in the life of Joseph:
 - -II Tim. 2:2 → flee also youthful lusts; I Cor. 6:18 → flee fornication
 - $-Js. 4:7 \rightarrow resist the devil;$
 - -I Pet. 2:19 → Remember the presence of God

III. Joseph Maintained Humility

- •In prison with the butler and baker. (Ch. 40)
 - -Their dreams. Joseph's humble reliance on God. (40:8)
- •The Pharaoh's dreams. (Ch. 41:16,25, 28, 32)
- •Joseph faces two great tests:
 - -Adversity: in prison did not become bitter.
 - -Prosperity (41:39-46): not filled with pride.
 - •Names of his children. (41:51-52)
 - •Faith in God to accomplish his purpose. (Gen. 45:7-9)
 - •He forgave. (45:5-10, 24; 50:15-21; Eph. 4:32; Lk. 23:34; Acts 2:38)
