The Last Words Of Jesus

Luke 23:44-49

Leading Up To The Death of Jesus...

- The sacrificial death of Jesus was God's plan from the beginning. (Gen. 3:15; I Pet. 1:18-20)
- Jesus fully understood his mission on earth. (Lk. 19:10; Matt. 20:28)
- He told the apostles what would take place. (Matt. 16:21)
- The plot of the Jews to kill Jesus. (Jn. 11:45-53)
- The night of his betrayal, Jesus eats the Passover with the apostles, tells of his betrayal and institutes His memorial supper. (Matt. 26:17-29)
- Jesus tells the apostles that they will all scatter that night and foretells Peter's denials. (Matt. 26:30-35)
- Prayer in the garden of Gethsemane. (Matt. 26:36-46; Jn. 18:11)
- Judas and the mob sent from the chief priests, scribes and elders, enter come to the garden and take Jesus away; the disciples flee and the sham trials begin. (Matt. 26:47-56)

The Trials of Jesus

- Jesus taken to Annas, former High Priest, and Father-inlaw, to Caiaphas, the current High Priest. (Jn. 18:12,19-24)
 - Annas asks Jesus of this teaching.
 - Jesus is slapped and sent to Caiaphas
- Jesus before Caiaphas, where scribes and elders are assembled. (Matt. 26:57-67; Mk. 14:53-66; Lk. 22:63-65)
 - False witnesses: said he will destroy and rebuild the temple of God in three days.
 - Jesus acknowledges He is the Son of God. (Mk. 14:61-62)
 - The Jews, slap, strike with fists, spit on and mock Jesus, then accuse Him of blasphemy.
- Jesus at daybreak before the Sanhedrin, and led before Pilate. (Lk. 22:66-71; Mk. 15:1)

The Trials of Jesus

- Jesus taken to Pontus Pilate. (Mk. 15:2-5; Lk. 23:1-6)
 - There he is accused by the Jews of insurrection by forbidding the paying of taxes, and declaring himself to be a king.
 - Pilate declares him innocent and sends him to Herod.
- Jesus before Herod. (Lk. 23:7-12)
 - Treated with contempt, mocked, robe put on him.
 - Returned to Pilate.
- Before Pilate the second time. (Matt. 27:15-21; Mk. 15:15-31; Lk. 23:13-25; Jn. 18:38-19:16)
 - Pilate again declares Jesus' innocence.
 - Offers Barabbas or Jesus.
 - Has Jesus scourged, crown of thorns put on his head and he is struck on the head with a staff, the purple robe and mock worship, led away to be crucified.

The Crucifixion Of Jesus...

- Mark 15:20-37 → ...And they led Him out to crucify Him.
- 21 They pressed into service a passer-by coming from the country,
 Simon of Cyrene (the father of Alexander and Rufus), to bear His cross.
- 22 Then they brought Him to the place Golgotha, which is translated, Place of a Skull.
- 23 They tried to give Him wine mixed with myrrh; but He did not take it.
- 24 <u>And they crucified Him</u>, and divided up His garments among themselves, casting lots for them to decide what each man should take.
- 25 It was the third hour when they crucified Him.
- 26 The inscription of the charge against Him read, "THE KING OF THE JEWS."
- 27 They crucified two robbers with Him, one on His right and one on His left.
- 28 [And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And He was numbered with transgressors."]
- 29 Those passing by were hurling abuse at Him, wagging their heads, and saying, "Ha! You who are going to destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days,

- 30 save Yourself, and come down from the cross!"
- 31 In the same way the chief priests also, along with the scribes, were mocking Him among themselves and saying, "He saved others; He cannot save Himself.
- 32 "Let this Christ, the King of Israel, now come down from the cross, so that we may see and believe!" Those who were crucified with Him were also insulting Him.
- 33 When the sixth hour came, darkness fell over the whole land until the ninth hour.
- 34 At the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "ELOI, ELOI, LAMA SABACHTHANI?" which is translated, "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?"
- 35 When some of the bystanders heard it, they began saying, "Behold, He is calling for Elijah."
- 36 Someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed, and gave Him a drink, saying, "Let us see whether Elijah will come to take Him down."
- 37 And Jesus uttered a loud cry, and breathed His last.

The Last Words of Jesus...

- "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." (Lk. 23:34)
- "Verily I say unto thee, Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." (Lk. 23:43)
- 26 When Jesus then saw His mother, and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" 27 Then He said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" From that hour the disciple took her into his own household. (Jn. 19:26-27)

The Last Words of Jesus...

- "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (Matt. 27:46; Mk. 15:34)
- "I Thirst". (Jn. 19:28)
- "It is finished."(Jn. 19:30)
- "Father, into they hand I commend my spirit." (Lk. 23:46)
