Hebrews 5:11-6:4

- 11 Of whom we have many things to say, and hard to be uttered, seeing ye are dull of hearing.
- 12 For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which *be* the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.
- 13 For every one that useth milk *is* unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe.
- 14 But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

Hebrews 5:11-6:4

- 1 Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and *go on to maturity,* not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God,
- 2 and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment.
- 3 And this we will do if God permits.
- 4 For it is impossible, in the case of those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit,

Introduction

- The importance of growth as a child of God becoming more and more complete, mature in our knowledge of God's word, our relationship with him and service in his kingdom.
- Becoming more and more focused in our hearts and minds on His will and those things that are spiritual and eternal in nature.
- As the Hebrew writer said to determine the difference between good and evil.
- Parallels between physical growth and spiritual growth. (Lk. 2:40,42)
- Necessities for normal physical growth, and the problem of failing to grow and become more mature. There is a <u>birth that brings one into this</u> <u>world</u>. There is the <u>necessary nourishment and conditions</u>. There is <u>exercise/activity necessary for development</u>. The exercise of <u>discernment, making choices and understanding the consequences</u>. And there is the <u>simple matter of time</u> for those things to bring about a mature being. No one is born full grown.
- So too it is true in the life and growth of a child of God.

- One must be born again.
 - Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth... (Js. 1:18; cf. I Pet. 1:23)
 - "...Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God...Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. (Jn. 3:3-5)
 - Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new. (II Cor. 5:17)

 - As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby: (I Pet. 2:2)
 - 15 And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. 16 All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: 17 That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works. (II Tim. 3:15-17)

 - "... Therefore put away all filthiness and rampant wickedness and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. (Js. 1:21 -- ESV)
 - 4 (For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) 5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ; (II Cor. 10:4-5)
 - Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it *are* the issues of life. (Prov. 4:23; cf. Matt. 15:18ff)

 (Heb. 5:12 ESV)
- For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. (II Pet. 1:8)
- 9 Lie not one to another, seeing that ye have put off the old man with his deeds; 10 And have put on the new man, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him: (Col. 3:9-10)
