Numbers 35:9-13

Numbers 35:9-13

- 9 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,
- 10 Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When ye be come over Jordan into the land of Canaan;
- 11 Then ye shall appoint you cities to be cities of refuge for you; that the slayer may flee thither, which killeth any person at unawares.
- 12 And they shall be unto you cities for refuge from the avenger; that the manslayer die not, until he stand before the congregation in judgment.
- 13 And of these cities which ye shall give six cities shall ye have for refuge.

Some Preliminary Observations...

- The cities of refuge were an integral part of Israel's possession and settlement of the promise land. Also a manifestation of God's grace.
- The provision of six cities provides evidence that God did give to Israel all the land promised to Abraham:
 - Gen. 12:1-7; esp. 7 \rightarrow The Promises
 - Deut. 19:1-13; esp. 8-9 → Three cities...if God give all land...three more
 - Josh. 20:1-9; esp. 7-8 \rightarrow Six cities named.
 - Josh. 21:43 \rightarrow God gave to Israel all the land.

Genesis 12:2-7

- 2 And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing:
- 3 And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed.
- 5 And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they <u>went</u> forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came.
- 7 And the LORD appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the LORD, who appeared unto him.

Deuteronomy 19:8-9

- 8 And <u>if the LORD thy God enlarge thy coast, as</u> <u>he hath sworn unto thy fathers, and give thee all</u> <u>the land</u> which he promised to give unto thy fathers;
- 9 If thou shalt keep all these commandments to do them, which I command thee this day, to love the LORD thy God, and to walk ever in his ways; <u>then shalt thou add three cities more for thee,</u> <u>beside these three</u>:

Joshua 20:7-8

- 7 And they appointed Kedesh in Galilee in mount Naphtali, and Shechem in mount Ephraim, and Kirjatharba, which is Hebron, in the mountain of Judah.
- 8 And on the other side Jordan by Jericho eastward, they assigned Bezer in the wilderness upon the plain out of the tribe of Reuben, and Ramoth in Gilead out of the tribe of Gad, and Golan in Bashan out of the tribe of Manasseh.



Joshua 21:43

 43 And the LORD gave unto Israel all the land which he sware to give unto their fathers; and they possessed it, and dwelt therein.

Some Preliminary Observations...


- God regards life as precious:
 - -Gen. 1:26-27 \rightarrow Made in God's image.
 - –Gen. 4:10 → Blood of Abel cries from the ground.
 - -Gen. 6:5, 11-12 \rightarrow The violence of the earth before the flood.
 - -Gen. 9:6 \rightarrow The penalty for murder -- death
 - Prov. 6:17 → God hates hands that shed innocent blood.

Some Preliminary Observations...

- God drew a distinction between accidental killing and murder.
 - Both very serious matters, but treated differently.
 - Thou shalt do no murder. (Ex. 20:13)
- God recognized a difference between murder, accidental death and capital punishment. (Ex. 21:12-13; Rom. 13:4; Acts 25:11)
- God provided a place of safety for those who accidentally took a life.
- Lesson: A look at these cities of refuge and some lesson we learn regarding the mercy of God.

The Cities of Refuge (Num. 35)

- Six cities to be appointed among the 48 Levitical cities. (Num. 35:1-8)
 - Ex. 21:13 \rightarrow first mention
 - Dt. 19:1-3 → a way to be provided; cities to be accessible.
 - To provide refuge for the manslayer. (Num. 35:9-15; Dt. 19:6)
 - Had to seek refuge in city.
 - To stand in judgment before the elders at the gate.
 - If found innocent of murder, to be delivered from avenger of blood.



Must remain till death of the high priest. Was subject to death if he failed to do so.

Lessons

- We need refuge. (Rom. 3:23; 6:23)
- God by His grace has mercifully provided refuge. (Jn. 3:16; Titus 3:3-5)
- One must flee to that refuge. (Matt. 11:28-30; Matt. 23:37)
- That refuge is His Son, Jesus Christ. In Him there is safety. (Rom. 8:1; Eph. 1:3; 2:13)
- He is the only option. (Acts 4:12; Jn. 14:6; Matt. 7:13-14)
- The refuge is accessible and clearly marked. (Rom. 1:16-17; Rom. 10:6-17; Acts 17:27)
- Conditions must be met to receive that refuge. (Rom. 10:9-10; Mk. 16:15-16)
- One must remain in that refuge to be secure. (Heb. 3:12-14)
- Ps. 46:1 → God *is* our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.
