The Day Of Pentecost -> Acts 2

Acts 2:16-21

Introduction

- The Day of Pentecost.
 - —Second of three annual Jewish feasts. (Dt. 16:16); Pentecost also called: The Feast of First Fruits, Weeks, Harvest.
 - -Apostles waiting in Jerusalem for promise of the Holy Spirit. (Jn. 14-16; Lk. 24:47-49; Acts 1:4-5.8)
 - The Apostles receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit. (Acts 2:1-4); Speak with other tongues. (Acts 2:6,7,8,11)

Lesson: Focus On Three Key Issues Addressed In Peter's Sermon:

- The meaning of that day's events. (v-12; 14-21)
- The identification of the Lord, God's Anointed. (v-21; 22-36)
- —Salvation -- The Forgiveness of sins (vv. 21,37; 38)

I. The Meaning of That Day's Events...

- The last days had begun. (Heb. 1:1-3)
 - —Old Testament prophecy had associated <u>the blessings of the Messianic Age</u> with the outpouring of the Spirit, and the significance of that day was the beginning of that age with its foretold blessings. (Acts 3:24; 11:15)
 - The Apostles were baptized with the Holy Spirit, and what they spoke was God's word.
 - —Joel's and other Old Testament prophecies are being fulfilled. (Isa. 2:2-4; Dan. 2:44)
- •Peter's sermon as an explanation of Joel's prophecy:
 - -Explains those events. (v-16)
 - -The destruction of Jerusalem (v-19-20)
 - -Salvation to those who call on the name of the Lord. (v-21) proceeds to tell who the Lord is...
 - —The outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Peter tells them that Jesus is doing it. (v-33)
 - -They are told to call on the name of the Lord in verse 21, and in verse 38 told how.
 - -In verse 39, Peter continues his quote of Joel 2.

II. Identifying Jesus of Nazareth As Lord and Christ

- •Approved of God. (v-22; Jn. 3:2; 9:31-33; Jn. 11:43)
- Delivered by determinate counsel. (v-23; Isa. 53; I Pet. 1:18-19)
- Crucified. (v-23; Matt. 27:35)
- •Slain. (v-23)
- •Raised. (v-24; Jn. 2:19ff; Rom. 1:3-4; I Cor. 15:20)
- Exalted. (v-33; Matt. 28:18; Eph. 1:22-23)
- •Shed forth this which ye now see and hear. (v-33)
- •Made both Lord and Christ. (v-36) Jesus of Nazareth, the one you put to death has been raised, and you must call on His name to be saved.

III. Salvation – The Forgiveness of Sins (calling on the name of the Lord)

- •Note: The Holy Spirit works by means of a powerful message. (v-37; Rom. 1:16; I Cor. 1:18)
- Not by...Faith only. (Js. 2:24); Just saying "Lord, Lord". (Matt. 7:21); By prayer. (Acts 9:11; 22:16)
- •Acts 2:21 ------Acts 2:28
 - → Whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord
- → Repent and be baptized

→ Shall be saved

→ For the remission of sins
